Program: Our guest speaker was Tom Bechtol, who is the Director of Security Screening Operations at the Greater Cincinnati Northern Kentucky International Airport. He has worked at the airport since 1996 minus a short stay in Baltimore.

He informed us that not all cargo on commercial flights is screened but 100% will be by the end of 2010.

CVG is the third airport to receive full body scanners that scan below clothing but can't penetrate the skin. An off-site security officer views the image in a secure control room and notifies the TSA gate officer if further investigation is required. However, you have the right to refuse to go thru the full body scanner and Tony Upton said that he would like a 25 year old blonde female to do his full body pat-down. ☺ In addition, individuals are being randomly selected to have their hands swabbed for explosives and eventually the metal detectors that are currently present will be eliminated with the introduction of full body scanners that will be able to penetrate the skin.

CVG is the training center for behavior detection officers. The course is based upon the EI AI behavioral training originally taught to the Israeli Massaud and perfected by *Avinoam Sapir* here in the United States.

In addition to the uniformed officers that you see at the gates, there are plain clothed officers also present roaming the airport.

CVG recently upgraded their closed circuit television (CCTV) to high definition (HD). They are now able to see how many hairs your mole has growing in it on your nose as soon as you exit I-275 for the airport.
