Our speaker today was Sandra Murphy who is with the Gorman Heritage Farm which is located in Evendale. Sandra has been with the Heritage Farm for 14 years. The farm was started in 1835. Jim and Dorothy Gorman donated the farm to the community so adults and children can see and visit a working farm.

The Gorman Heritage Farm is a working farm. They maintain livestock and grow corn and vegetables which are sold to produce income to maintain the farm.

The Gorman Farm also grow sunflowers which are their signature. They have a Sunflower Fair in the Fall every year.

The Gorman Farm has a collection of farm tractors and implements over 100. They have walking trails and a picnic area.

Gorman Heritage Farm Facts

- 50 schools visited the farm in 2009
- 2800 students made field trips to the farm. 11 volunteers lead the field trips
- 260 children attended camp in 2009
- 250 active volunteers
